When Paul looked for leaders in the early church, he looked for a certain kind of person.

1 Timothy 3:1-7

Titus 1:5-10

These are qualifications for leaders. However, they are also character traits that every Christian man should possess.

- Above reproach / Blameless
- Husband of one wife
- Temperate
- Sober-minded
- Respectable / Of good behavior
- Hospitable
- Able to teach / Holding fast the faithful Word as he has been taught
- Not given to wine
- Not self-willed
- Not quick-tempered
- Not violent

- Not quarrelsome
- Gentle
- Free from the love of money / Not covetous
- One who manages his own household well
- A good reputation with those outside the church
- Love what is good
- Just / Holy
- Not a new convert
- Self-controlled

This list goes beyond generalizations and gives specific characteristics of a man or woman of God.

2. Free from the love of money / Not covetous

1 Timothy 6:9-10

We also need money for
We are instructed not to love money or be covetous.
You do not have to be rich to love money. Many people who do not have money, still love it.

Free from the love of money and not being covetous also hold other definitions that are important, especially when it comes to leadership.

3. One who manages his own household well

This does not mean that a man of God must be married and have children.

1 Timothy 3:4

The word children in the Greek is used to describe children who are still under parental guidance at home.

This verse presents the idea of a person who carries himself with dignity and treats other people with courtesy and respect.

If the children are disrespectful towards authority and resentful when they are asked to do something it reveals the attitude of the parents.

A true leader most often has children who are servants.

This is why Paul the apostle put this in the list. If you are looking to put someone in a leadership position all you have to do is look at their children. How their children speak to each other and treat other people reveal what is going on in the home.

This also brings about another thought - What happens in a person's private life will spill over into the public life.

Paul encouraged Timothy to dig deeper into the personal life of a person before putting them in a public position.

Definition of RULES:

- Someone who is standing up in front in order to lead, guide, direct, or manage a situation.
- It conveys the idea of a leader who is responsible for giving oversight and direction to a group of people.
