Who is Paul?
Before his conversion his name was and it was changed to Paul after his conversion according to Acts 13:9
Before Christ
Philippians 3:4-5:
All Jewish baby boys were circumcised according to Jewish law. However, only Jews who strictly observed Jewish law circumcised their baby boys on the eighth day.
Stock of Israel - means he was pure Jewish and not mixed with any other race. This phrase showed a sense of "elitism" or "I am better than others."
- most cherished tribe of all of Israel. In other words, he was saying, "They don't come much better than me."
<u>Hebrew of Hebrews</u> - means he was born to Hebrew parents who follow the Hebrew laws and obey Hebrew customs and speak the Hebrew language.
1Timothy 1:12-13
Paul describes himself in his own words as a:
Blasphemer: to speak foul, nasty, and profane words, to humiliate somebody through words
Insolent:

Persecutor: high-level, violent hunter

Paul hunted down believers he would torcher, imprison, and kill violently.

Example: The death of Stephen
Stephen was anointed a deacon in the church.

The laying down of the clothes "cloaks" at Saul's feet shows who had an officiating role in the stoning of Stephen and it was a way the witnesses testified against the accused.

Paul was a man so consumed with hatred and rage. Luke, the author of the Book of Acts says this man became like a sick pig.

One day Paul was traveling down the road to Damascus to persecute Christians when he has an encounter with Jesus that completely changes his life.

Then he got healed, filled with the Holy Spirit, and baptized all at one time. Paul is known as the greatest missionary of all time. He went to the ends of the known world to bring the Gospel message to all the lost people groups of the earth. He wrote _____ books of the New Testament. He persevered through some of the toughest persecution recorded. Paul wrote about what he went through: 2 Corinthians 11:24-27 Paul's First Missionary Journey (Acts 13-14) The church at Antioch was praying and fasting when the Holy Spirit spoke to them to set apart Barnabas and Paul. They laid hands on them and then sent them off. The Bible way: Missionaries are ______. Paul and Barnabas set sail with John as their helper for 2 years. They went to Cyprus and proclaimed the Word of God in the Jewish Synagogues They traveled through the whole island and came to Paphos where they ran into a Jewish sorcerer and false prophet named Bar- Jesus. Then they went to Antioch. Then they travelled to Iconium and taught in the Jewish synagogue where a great number of Jews and Gentiles converted. Next, they went to Lystra and Derbe where the Galatian church was planted. After ministering in Derbe, they returned to Lystra, Iconium, and Attalia and then they returned to Antioch from where they first set sail. They spent some time in Antioch before their second journey (Acts 14:27-28)

During his first missionary journey Paul wrote a letter to the church at Galatia also known as the

Paul's Second Missionary Journey (Acts 16-18)

Just before Paul's second missionary journey Paul and Barnabas had a disagreement about whether they should bring John or not. They decided to go their own separate ways.
Paul took Silas on his second missionary journey which lasted
During this trip they went back to a lot of the same places to strengthen the churches they planted on their first trip.
They went to Derbe and Lystra where they met Timothy. They decided to bring Timothy on their ourney.
He was led by the Holy Spirit not to go to Asia to preach.
Then Paul had a vision that showed him he was to go to Damascus (Macedonia) and preach the Gospel.
In Damascus Paul faced a lot of opposition but despite this he planted two churches - one in Philippi and one in Thessalonica.
Then went on to Thessalonica, Brea, Athens, Corinth, and Ephesus. Then to Jerusalem and back to Antioch.
During his second missionary journey Paul wrote

Paul's Third Missionary Journey (Acts 18:23-Acts 21:14)

After he spent a little time in Antioch, Paul set out on his third missionary journey which lasted 4 years.

Again, he visited Galatia and Phrygia with the intent of strengthening his brothers and sisters in Christ.

Ephesus experienced a great revival during Paul's visit. He performed many signs, wonders, and miracles and many people came to Christ.

The Bible says the Word of the Lord spread quickly and grew in power. However, this also caused a great riot in the city. The unbelievers were angry because their way of life was being threatened. After things were quieted down, Paul met with the disciples in Ephesus and encouraged them. Then he said good-bye and left for Macedonia

He was accompanied by 7 men. They visited Philippi, Thessalonica, Berea, and Corinth.

Paul was about to go back to Syria but was stopped when he discovered a plot against his life.

He stopped at Troas.

Paul by-passed Ephesian but he rather called for the elders to come and meet him in Miletus. .

During his third missionary journey while in Ephesus Paul wrote				
In these two letters he addressed false doctrines and some other specific concerns.				
End of Paul's life				
Paul received a prophecy he would be persecuted in Jerusalem. The people who he was staying with in Caesarea pleaded with him not to go but Paul knew he needed to.				
None of Paul's journeys were easy but his journey to Jerusalem was nothing but pain and difficulty. He made his way to Jerusalem where he would be bound hand and foot by the Jews and then given over to the Gentiles.				
In Jerusalem Paul was met by men who sought to destroy him. He was beaten, falsely accused, imprisoned, and transferred from one place to the next, shipwrecked, and held under house arrest for a total of 4 years.

Persevering through suffering in the bible is not talking about going through sickness or a tragedy that happens in our life. It is talking about enduring persecution.
