What is an Apostle?
We need to understand this word was not first a biblical word it was a
<u>Definition</u>
Greek "apostolos" was a compound word (2 words) comes from another Greek word "apostello" (original word)
Apo
Stello
Together means one who is sent away, a messenger, a delegate who is commissioned to represent another person
Stello comes from another word which means a military expedition or campaign, an army or a navy - the idea of a military assault
The word gives the picture of a military expedition sent to the front line to crush the enemy and take new territory
Apostolic ministry is a
Apostles are sent into to crush the enemy and take new territory for the Kingdom of God
The word "Apostolos" appears in the New Testament times
The word "apostello" is used times in the New Testament
The word is also used in the Old Testament (Greek Septuigent)
This word is not a mystery. It is very clearly defined in the Bible
It describes a person who is dispatched
Other things the word implies:
One that is sent away in great
One that is sent away in great

- One who is empowered
- One who is dispatched to the frontlines to carry out a military campaign

The word apostle depicts a person who was personally selected and dispatched by a very high-ranking military dignitary to accomplish a specific task

<u>The word "apostolos" was used 4 different ways within context of the culture of the New Testament church</u>

The word apostolos was used in the Bible times as a word to describe the admiral of a fleet of military ships. The fleet of ships that travelled with him carried a specialized crew that accompanied him and assisted him.

Also, the word "apostolos" was so attached to traveling that it became the New Testament		
word for "		
It was the name given to a traveling document. If they wanted to leave the country, they needed an "apostolos". It gave them the right of passage to travel.

The word "apostolos" was also the New Testament word for an		
<u>Definition of ambassador</u> : a high ranking representative, a person who has the authority to act in the place of the one who sent him, diplomat		
When an ambassador speaks, they have the authority to speak on behalf of his sender.

The word was used to describe a, one who has been endowed by the gods with supernatural insights and revelation.

Summary:

The word Apostle carried all these meanings. So, when the people of the early church heard or read the word "apostle" they understood the meaning of the word.

An apostle was specially selected, specially commissioned, and specially sent to represent the Lord in a variety of ways.

An apostle was a spiritual admiral, a spiritual architect, an overseer, a coordinator, and the chief leader responsible for "colonizing" new territories with the word of God and New Testament church culture.

An apostle provided passage from one spiritual dimension to another, and his anointing would enable a church to journey into levels of spiritual growth that it would possible never reach apart from the apostles anointing

An apostle was authorized to speak and act on the Lord's behalf and like an ambassador, he represented Jesus Christ and had the backing of God's kingdom behind him and as the envoy of Christ, he had the anointing and spiritual backing and authority to get things accomplished.

An apostle possesses supernatural insights for the building up and growth of the church

Paul describes the characteristics of an apostle:

2 Corinthians 12:12 (KJV)
Definition of patience : to stay, abide, remain in one's spot, to keep one's position, to resolve to maintain territory, to hang in and staying power, refusing to surrender, turning down every opportunity to quit
It pictures a soldier who maintains their position
<u>Signs</u>
This word describes
Paul had miraculous activities at key pivotal moments when he came into new territory
Example: when he came to the Corinthians

Refer to an event that leaves one baffled, bewildered or astonished, an event that leaves one at a loss of words.
