



**Pastoral Epistles Part 2**  
**Titus Chapter Three**

**1. Instructions from a Pastor Titus to the people**

**Titus 3:1, 2**

**Titus 3:8**

“Good works” is mentioned twice in these verses of scripture. “Good works” refers to the good we do because of our faith in Christ.

We are commanded to be ready for every good work and to maintain good works.

At the end of the previous chapter, we are told that Jesus redeemed us so that He would have a people who are zealous for good works.

**Titus 2:14**

Christians are to be zealous for good works. We are to be ready to do them and have the mentality of maintaining them.

- Zealous for good works

Definition of ZEALOUS: Enthusiasm; boiling over with passion; deeply committed

- Ready for good works

Definition of READY: You are ready because you have done the necessary preparations; ready and prepared

- Maintain good works

Paul continues to write to Titus about false teachers who are trying to impose the law upon Gentile believers.

Their teaching brought division in the church. Paul told Titus, "Reject a divisive man after the first and second admonition."

If he was still having problems with the divisive man after bringing correction two times, Titus was to reject him. This means he as to avoid him and remove him from any office he may have held in the church.

Verse eleven shows three characteristics of someone who continues in false teaching:
