Ephesians 5:1-11	- New Living Translation
Ephesians 3:1	When I think of all this, I, Paul, a prisoner of Christ Jesus for the benefit of you Gentiles
Ephesians 3:2	assuming, by the way, that you know God gave me the special responsibility of extending His grace to you Gentiles.
Ephesians 3:3	As I briefly wrote earlier, God Himself revealed His mysterious plan to me.
Ephesians 3:4	As you read what I have written, you will understand my insight into this plan regarding Christ.

Ephesians 3:9	I was chosen to explain to everyone this mysterious plan that God, the Creator of all things, had kept secret from the beginning.
Ephesians 3:10	God's purpose in all this was to use the church to display His wisdom in its rich variety to all the unseen rulers and authorities in the heavenly places.
Ephesians 3:11	This was His eternal plan, which He carried out through Christ Jesus our Lord.
Ephesians 3:10, 11 -	- Contemporary English Version
Ephesians 3:10	Then God would use the church to show the powers and authorities in the spiritual world that he has many different kinds of wisdom.
Ephesians 3:11	God did this according to his eternal plan. And he was able to do what he had planned because of all that Christ Jesus our Lord had done.

The word "ekklesia" is used 114 times in the New Testament.
