If you love Jesus, you must love whom He loves. He loves the lost. He loves the hurting. He loves those who follow Him. He loves the church.

Pastors and leaders make mistakes.

The church is an organization of imperfect people who are accepting of other imperfect people. These imperfect people begin to understand they have a purpose, and together, try to make a difference in the world.

"The church really hurt me."

There is no such thing as the church hurting someone.

It is like saying:

- "The bank really hurt me."
- "Restaurants have wounded me."
- "The gym hurt my feelings."

It is not the entities or organizations that have hurt us - it's the people in them. The people who work in restaurants have let me down. I've managed to find others places to eat.

There are people who work out at my gym that could very well be hypocrites.

If you have been hurt, violated, or abused in a church – forgive those people so that you can continue to grow in your faith.

All churches need to have some accountability. We need to be confident enough to hear the criticisms . . .

However, because you see a flaw in a church you don't approve of - it is not necessary to add your voice to the growing sound of church bashing that is growing in America today.

God plans to use the church to reveal His awesome plan to humanity.

What does all of this mean for us today? – Your salvation is more than your personal decision to follow Christ.

You have become a part of something that involves corporate power, life, and blessing.

Your salvation is not a "me" deal. It is a "we" deal.

We have concentrated so much on our "personal" salvation that we have forgotten that there is something much greater that God has called us to.

You have been called into covenant with other believers – to be a part of something bigger than just yourself.

7. What you think and believe will ultimately be revealed in how you live.

This is true for every area of life, _____

What we think and believe about church, influences the way we live and act.

That is why the Word of God tells us that we need our minds renewed.

Personally this is true. In the church this is true.

Do you truly believe that as a Christian you are destined to win?

Do we truly believe the commission we have been given as a Church will be victorious?

The example of the children of Israel coming out of Egypt:

- The goal was not to get them out of Egypt.

- It is important to understand that they either all went in, or none went in.

• The Promised Land is not just about personal destiny. It is about corporate destiny.

Generally, in the church we have developed an individualized thinking like this – God will heal me. God will prosper me. He will deliver me. He will do all of this through my personal faith.

Although this is true and Biblical, we often forget this truth – There are some victories that will only be secured when you and I link up together.

You can go a long way on your own, but you cannot go all the way on your own.
