



**Your Covenant with God: The Power of the Blood Covenant**  
**Lesson 5: Passover, the Blood of Jesus & Communion - Part 2**

Introduction / Review

**Hebrews 8:6**

In the previous lesson we began looking at Passover and the blood of Jesus.

We saw how the sacrifice of the Passover lamb pointed to Jesus and His sacrifice on the cross for us. We also looked at what the blood of Jesus speaks to us.

In this lesson we are going to continue to look at the power of the blood of Jesus and communion.

The Cleansing of the Leper

Like Passover, the cleansing of the leper in the Old Testament speaks prophetically of the blood of Jesus.

Leprosy is a \_\_\_\_\_

The cleansing of the leper foreshadowed God's future plan to cleanse all mankind from sin.

**Leviticus 14:2**

The leper was brought to the priest.

**Leviticus 14:3, 4**

Comparing Leviticus with Jesus

- The priest went outside the camp. Jesus was crucified outside the walls of Jerusalem.
- The two birds symbolize Jesus' \_\_\_\_\_

- Cedar wood represents the cross.
- Scarlet is symbolic of Jesus' suffering.
- Hyssop symbolizes faith because it was used in the application of the blood. We apply the blood of Jesus to our lives by faith.

**Leviticus 14:5, 6**

The bird that was killed over an earthen vessel represents Jesus who died for us in His human body.

**Leviticus 14:7**

This speaks of our sins being cleansed by the blood of Jesus. The bird is \_\_\_\_\_

God anoints what the blood has covered. The anointing follows the blood. The oil will flow where the blood has already been.

The rest of the oil was poured onto the cleansed man. As a believer, the anointing and power of the Holy Spirit should touch every aspect of your life.

## Communion

When Jesus and His disciples celebrated Passover, at what we call the “Last Supper”, communion, or the Lord’s Table was instituted.

In the previous lesson, we saw the significance of everything Jesus did during the Passover meal with His disciples.

Let’s take a look at communion in the New Covenant.

### **1 Corinthians 11:23-31**

#### **1 Corinthians 10:16**

There is communion in the communion. In other words, when we take communion we are to have communion or fellowship with the Lord Himself.

When we celebrate communion there are four things we should remember.

### Four Things to Remember When Celebrating Communion

1. \_\_\_\_\_

We are celebrating a covenant meal.

We are reminding ourselves that we have a covenant with God.

He is our protector, shield, redeemer, and healer.

2. \_\_\_\_\_

As we eat and drink, we are symbolically putting the body and blood of Christ in us.

This speaks of Christ living in you.

#### **Colossians 1:27**

3. \_\_\_\_\_

There was one piece of matzah broken among the disciples. Each one had a small part of it. This signifies that we are all part of the same Body of Christ.

4. \_\_\_\_\_

Make sure there is no division in the Body. There should be unity.

Also, we must discern that the Lord's Body was broken for your physical healing.

**Isaiah 53:4**

**Matthew 8:16, 17**

When we celebrate communion we remember all of the good things Jesus did for us.

Psalm 103 tells us what Jesus did for us.

We are commanded to remember what he has done for us.

Our sins are forgiven and we are healed of everything!

**Psalm 103:4**

He redeems our lives from destruction and shows us lovingkindness and mercy.

**Psalm 103:5**

He gives us good things and renews our youth.

**Psalm 103:6**

Because of the cross, we are defended from the oppressor.

**Hebrews 10:19**

Here is another thing to remember when we take communion – we have access to God's presence by the blood of Jesus.

The Corinthian church turned communion into a vain ceremony.

### Judging Ourselves

If we judge \_\_\_\_\_, God will not have to judge us.

**1 Corinthians 11:31**

Psalm 32 tells us how God judges man and how man can judge himself.

**Psalm 32:1-3**

When David did not judge himself or confess his sin his physical body was affected.

**Psalm 32:4**

Because of unconfessed sin, he wasn't having communion or fellowship with God.

**Psalm 32:5**

You come back into the Lord's favor by judging yourself. David confessed his sin and sought after the Lord.

1 Samuel 13:14 refers to David as a man after God's own heart.

**Psalm 32:6**

The Bible calls those who confess their sins \_\_\_\_\_

**Psalm 32:7**

This shows how David's relationship with God changed after he confessed his sin.

After you judge yourself and confess sin, you are ready for communion.

When we remember what Jesus did for us, the presence of God will come and we can have fellowship with Him.
